Discussion: The Court confirmed that it is settled that when a claimant works for both a

general and special employer, the award may be ordered to be paid by the general, special or both. The Board is empowered to make the award as it sees fit. There was evidence that Acme set the schedule, could terminate the claimant and controlled his activities. Vanety paid the claimant's wages and was responsible per agreement to supply workers' compensation coverage for those workers it

sends to Acme.
